



WHAT'S NEW IN THE BUILDING NEAR KAMIANETS-PODILSKYI?

In January, we:

- finished the installation of the filter field for sewage treatment facilities;
- replaced the fire extinguishing system, and started installing the fire alarm;
- completed replacing the electric wiring on floors 1 to 4;
- finished installing the heating everywhere except for shared spaces;
- are completing the tiling of bathrooms and kitchens;
- ordered kitchen furniture, beds, tables, chairs, and lamps;
- started installing sanitary ware in the bathrooms.



ALSO, IN THIS BUILDING:

In shared spaces, we:

- approved technical documents for installing the heating;
- finished the dismantling, installed water supply and sewerage, and started making new partition walls.

On floors 3 and 4, we:

- painted the walls, hallways, and bathrooms, and are currently finishing floor 2;
- lay linoleum and put baseboard;
- finished installing doors and accessories;
- started hanging lamps;
- install sockets and switches.



RENOVATION OF THE FORMER HOTEL: HOW IS IT GOING?

This month, we launched the boiler room - it is finally warm at the hotel!

In addition:

- tables, beds, and shelving units were brought to the rooms;
- we ordered materials for the facade insulation, set up scaffolding, and are waiting for warmer weather to start work;
- ventilation was installed;

• contractors are completing small tasks - finishing painting works halted by cold weather, restoring the parquet floor in the dining room, cleaning floors from construction dirt.

And we are forming the list of residents.



OUTDOOR FURNITURE

In January, we installed outdoor furniture near one of the CO-HATY buildings. First, we held workshops with stakeholders, formed a spatial development strategy, and designed and produced the first batch of outdoor furniture. In this process, we received support from the Izolyatsia platform and New Democracy Fund.

We started with basic elements that activate public space. These included:

- benches;
- portable tables and benches for Caritas, which operates in this building;
- bicycle parking;
- metal racks below windows for drying clothes, keeping houseplants, or storing food.



SCOUTING FOR THE UPCOMING CO-HATY BUILDINGS

The CO-HATY team seeks for the next buildings to refurbish and create housing for internally displaced people. This month, we visited sites at Kamianets-Podilskyi, Ivano-Frankivsk, and the neighboring territorial communities.



CO-HATY: EVENTS AND MEDIA



FUNDS




