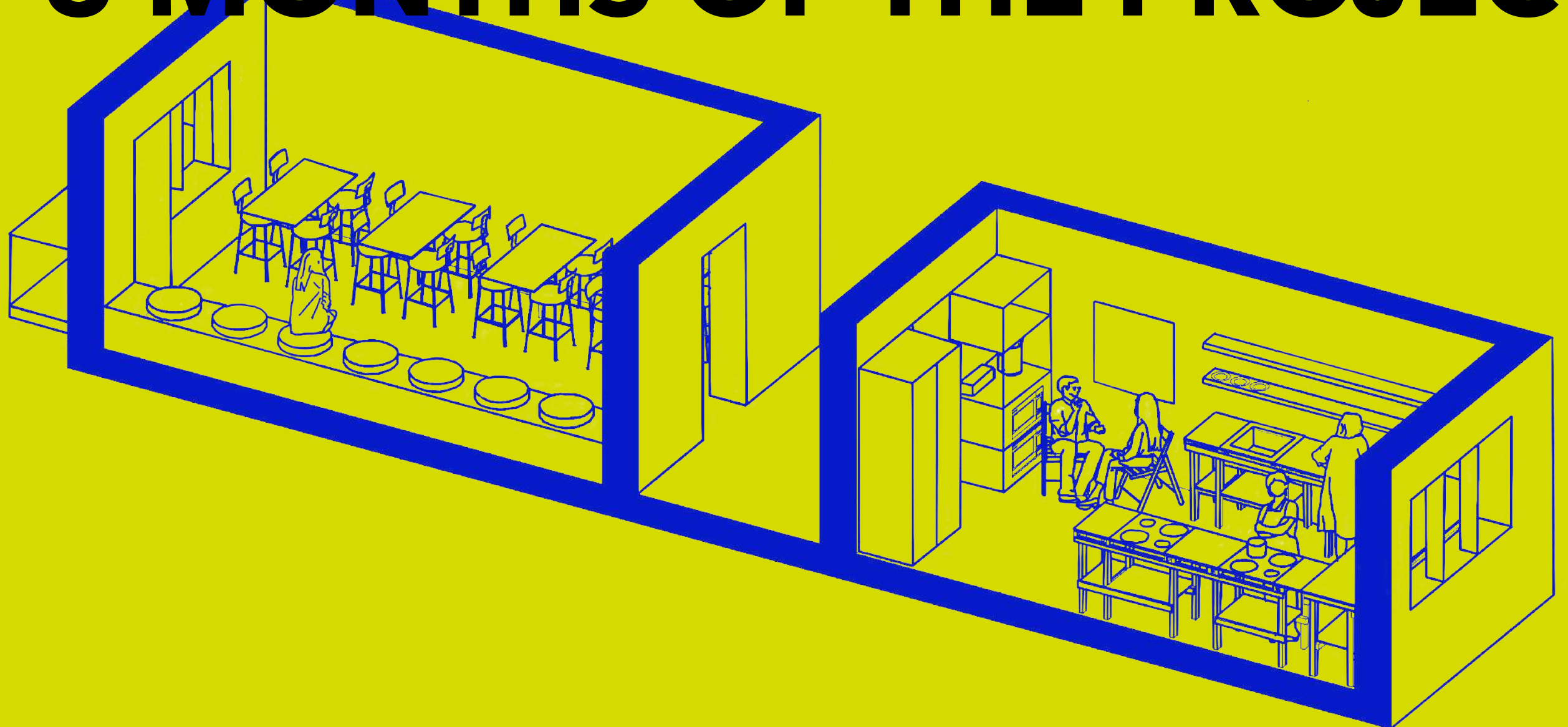
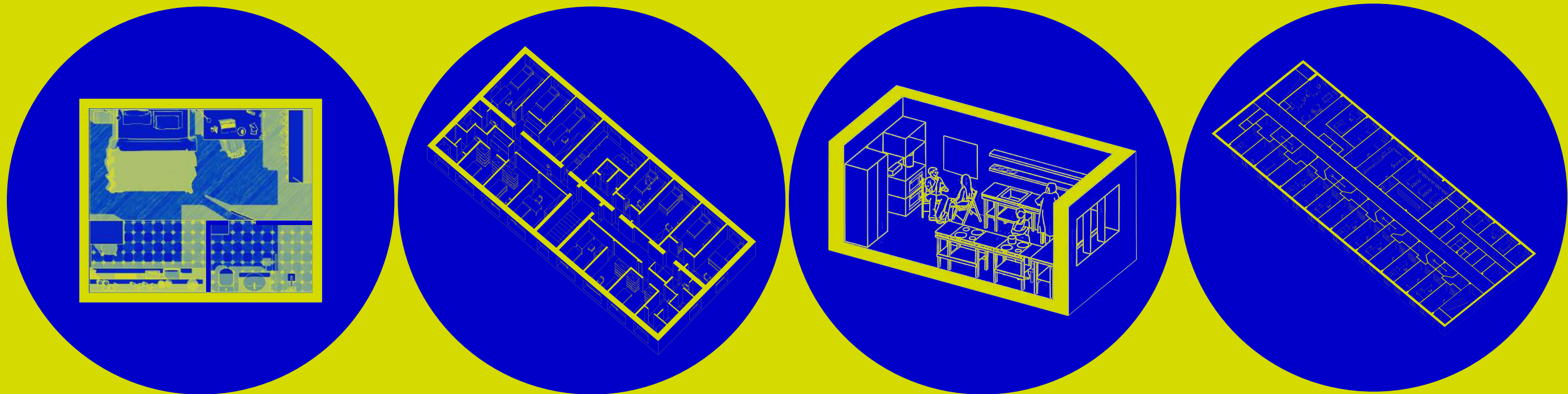

CO-HATY PROJECT SCALES UP

We don't slow down - over the previous month have developed four design projects of housing for IDPs in the buildings of:

- former hotel (Ivano-Frankivsk)
- kindergarten (Ivano-Frankivsk)
- student dormitory (Kamianets-Podilskyi)
- unfinished construction of the dormitory (Ivano-Frankivsk)

Financing for most of the projects is provided or in the pipeline. For one of the buildings, we are currently seeking co-financing.



RENOVATING THE FORMER HOTEL

We have started with renovating the dining room and kitchen. Here, we:

- cleaned and restored wooden decor;
- cleared the parquet flooring of paint;
- restored wooden window frames;
- plastered and painted walls and ceiling;
- designed and constructed wooden benches;
- decluttered the kitchen sewer, brought in water, and installed a sink.



NEW ROOF FOR THE HOTEL

The old roofing was dismantled, a new wooden structure was built and insulated, the roof hatch was made, and the roof covering changed.

200 m² of the roof was insulated.

Also:

- replaced water pipes in all rooms;
- dismantled the plumbing system - toilets, sinks, taps;
- replaced the heating system;
- installed extractor fans in showers.

In private rooms

1837 m² walls are cleaned and restored. We have already removed the wallpaper and cleaned the walls of the mold.
340 m² of tiles dismantled.

After the dismantling, we carried down tons of tiles and concrete.



COLLABORATION WITH MOBILE MAKERSPACE TOLOCAR

Our partner CADUS equipped a vehicle with tools and consumables in Berlin, invited craftspersons, and drove here. The makerspace team joined CO-HATY at the hotel we are renovating. Together, we restored windows, picked the color, and designed furniture for the dining room.

TOLOCAR is a program implemented in collaboration with MitOst e.V. and assisted by the German Government via the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH.



AID FROM DUG AND HEARTS FOR UKRAINE

CO-HATY received a 40-ton truck of household items. Such as mattresses, bedclothes, blankets, dinnerware, electric kettles, toasters, etc.

These items were collected and provided by DUG (Deutsch Ukrainische Gesellschaft Rhein Neckar e. V.) and Hearts for Ukraine, upon the initiative of Anna Kuzyshyn.



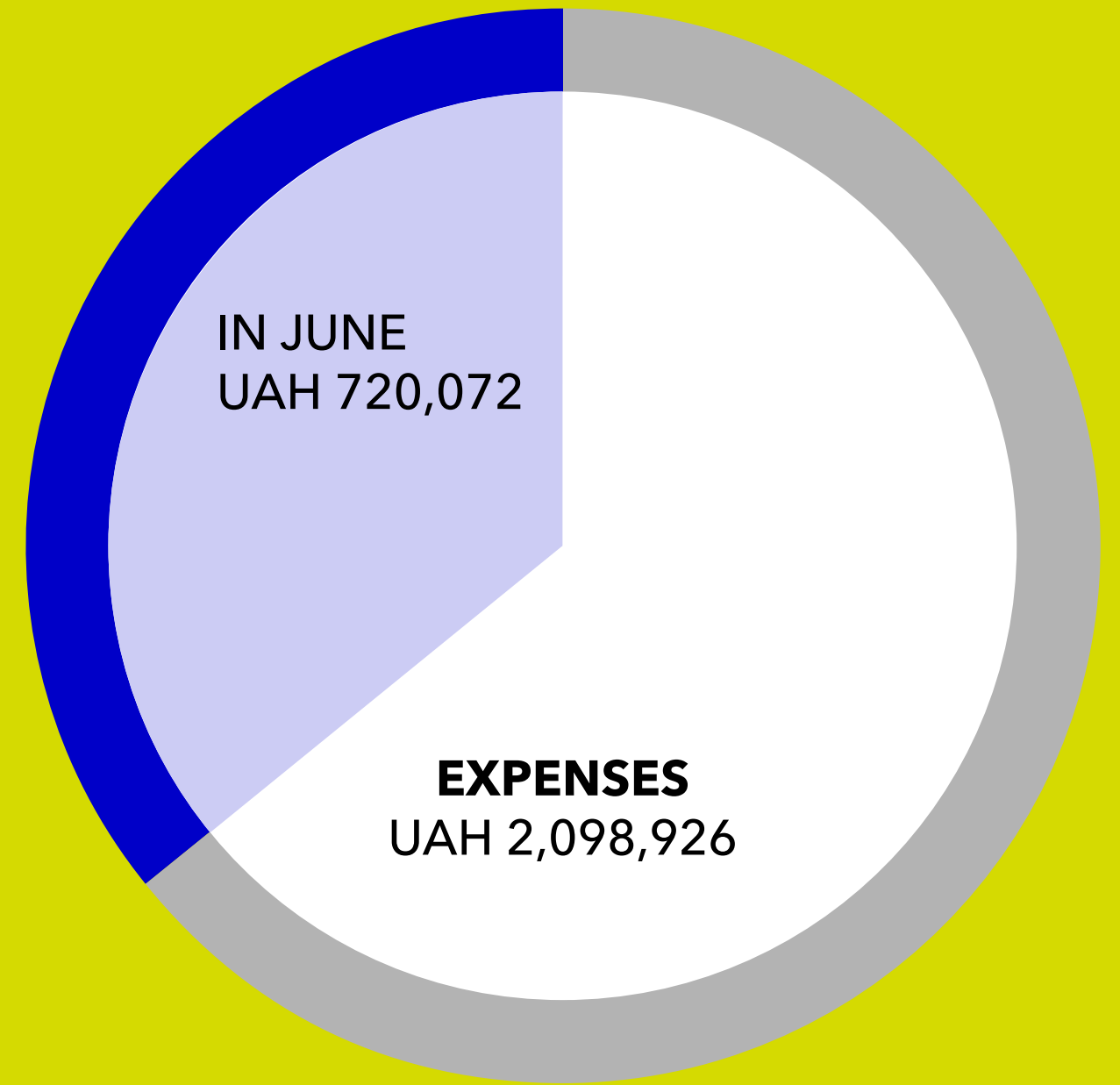
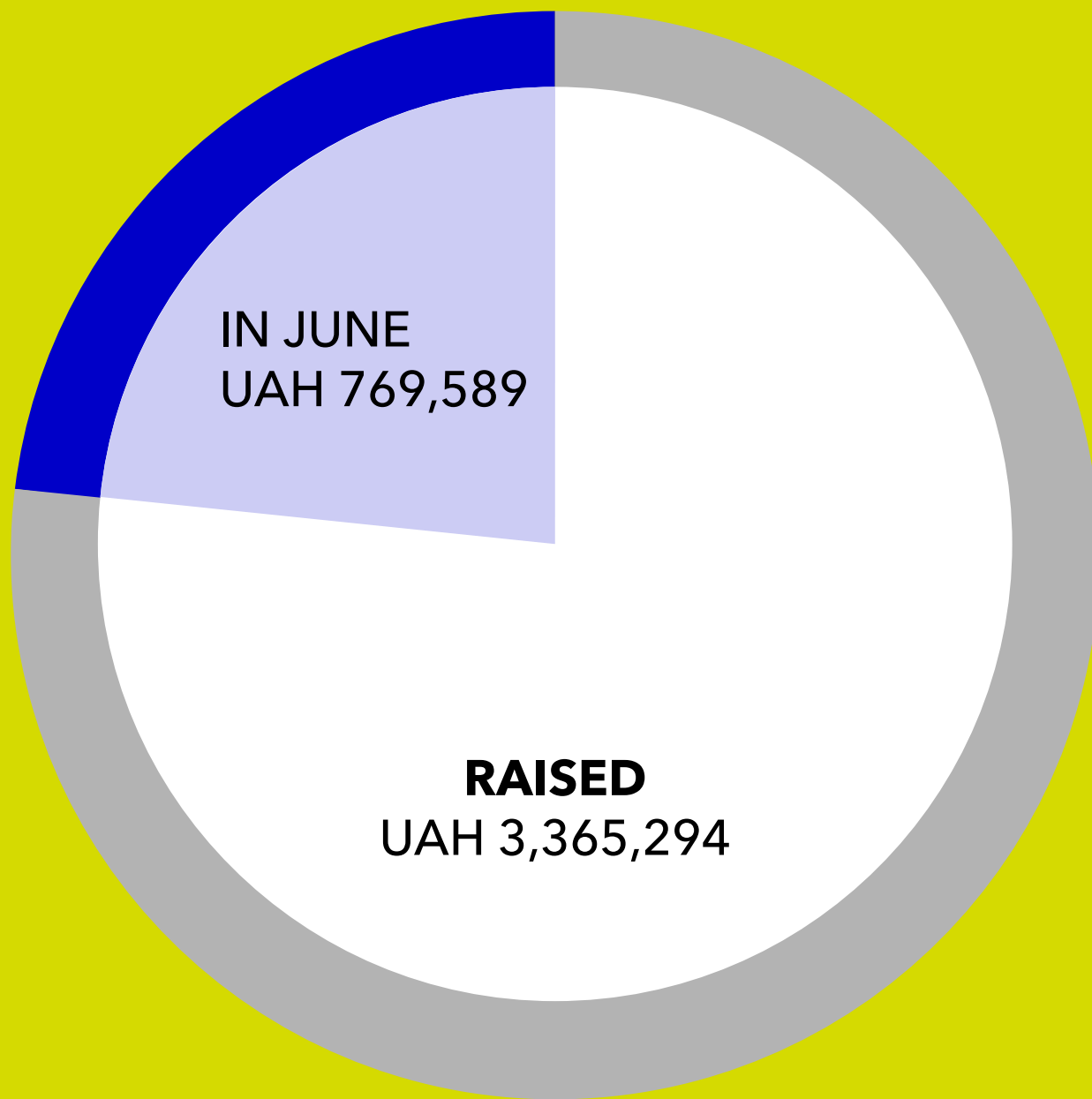
CO-HATY: MEDIA AND EVENTS

FUNDS



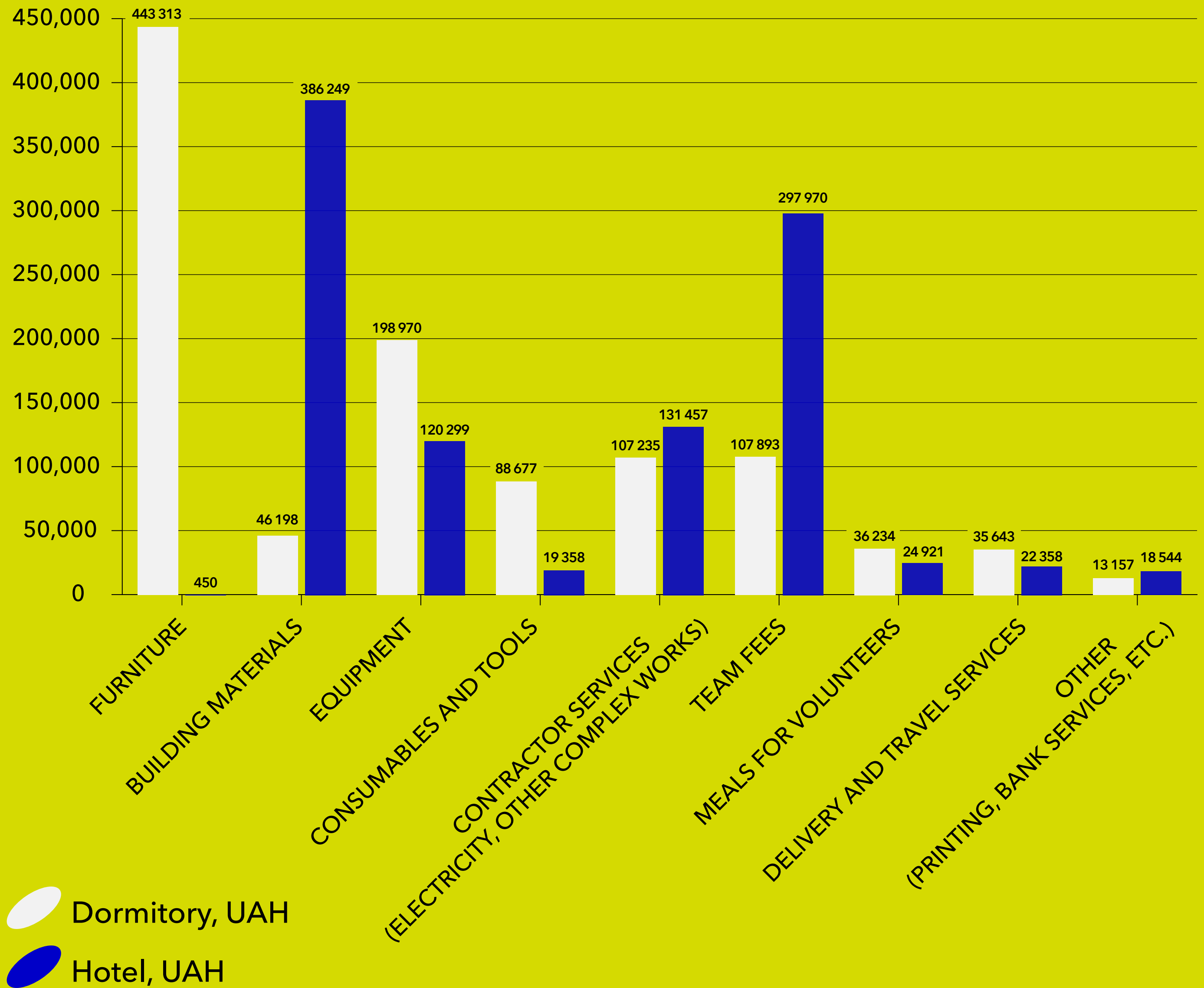
Since the launch of the CO-HATY project, we have raised UAH 3,365,294.
In June - UAH 769,589.

As of July 1, total expenses amounted to UAH 2,098,926.
In June, the expenses were UAH 720,072.
